#### Man hits woman, resists deputies

A Waukegan man was arrested after a witness said he saw him pulling a woman's hair and striking her inside a vehicle parked at Wal-Mart, 3500 Brumback Blvd., Friday night.

The 49-year-old suspect was taken into custody in the 7:56 p.m. incident, according to a Kenosha County Sheriff's Department report. Authorities recommended charges of battery and disorderly conduct both involving domestic violence. An additional charge of resisting an officer was also added.

According to the report, the suspect became angry because he could not find his cellphone. A witness said he pulled the woman's hair before striking her three to four times.

Later, authorities said the suspect tried to walk away from the scene.
